WHAT IS SEMESTER AT CSUN?

Semester at CSUN (SAC) is a study abroad program that enables international students to attend the university for up to one year. In all classes, SAC students are integrated with degree-seeking students.

Semester at CSUN provides:

- Access to university classes in a variety of departments
- Academic credits that may be transferred to a student's home university
- Academic advisement and registration assistance

STUDENT EXPERIENCE

The SAC program focuses on personal support to help each student succeed at CSUN and have a memorable and meaningful semester abroad. Here is what you can expect:

- **Housing** Live in dorms on campus or in apartments around CSUN.
- **Orientation** Start the program with an orientation week and a "Welcome to L.A." tour.
- **Campus Life** Join student clubs, play sports, attend special events, and access the university's fitness and health centers.
- **Student Support** Receive assistance from experts trained to help international students.

 - Immigration assistance

E PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

All applicants must:

- Be at least 18 years old
- Have completed high school by the program's start date
- Have a 2.0 minimum grade point average for university or high school courses (based on a 4.0 grading system) or equivalent
- Meet the English-language proficiency requirement for undergraduate students: TOEFL iBT = 61 or IELTS
 = 6.0 (contact the SAC program for country-specific equivalencies that are also accepted).

Just finished high school? SAC is for you, too!

The SAC program lets you experience life as a college freshman. You can live in the dorms, explore the city, join clubs and Greek life, and earn university credit – all without committing to a degree. It's perfect for a gap year or a taste of American life!

🕵 HOW TO APPLY

STEP 1

The Semester at CSUN application is online: *go.csun.edu/SAC-apply* Upload and submit the required documents with the online application.*

STEP 2

After you apply, you will receive an email with instructions to:

- □ Activate your CSUN username and password.
- □ Make an online Program Tuition payment.

STEP 3

Upon admission, you will receive an acceptance packet and a Form I-20. Using your Form I-20, apply for an F-1 Student Visa and set your travel plans to enter the U.S.

STEP 4

You will be assigned an academic advisor to help you select and enroll in CSUN courses. Enrollment is based on eligibility and course availability.

STEP 5

CSUN

Arrive in Los Angeles at least one week before the semester begins to attend SAC Orientation. Congratulations! You are now an American college student!
